Background

The Barents Sea and the northern areas are important issues in Norwegian politics. Norwegian and foreign companies and organizations pay increasing attention to the commercial and environmental aspects of the exploitation of hydrocarbon resources. The oil and gas in the north are also important from many other points of view. But there are more to the northern areas than Shtokman and Melkøya. Even though each of the Focus North studies is short, the ambition has been that they together will provide a holistic view of the northern areas and the opportunities and challenges these parts of the world offer.

The Norwegian Atlantic Committee commissioned the *Focus North* studies. The Committee and its Secretary General, Mr Chris Prebensen, have a long standing interest in and a longer commitment than most other in Norway to the study of the affairs of the northern areas.
